10 Tips to help you and your child make going to school easier:

X	1		Help get your child's book bag ready the night before.
X	2		Make sure your child's uniform is ready the night before.
N.	3	\checkmark	Get them to bed on time so they have a good night's sleep.
No.	4	√ 1:30-	Set the alarm clock early enough to allow plenty of time to get ready.
3.A	5	✓	Make sure your child has a healthy breakfast.
N.	6		Check that your child has everything before you leave the house: <i>coat, book bag, PE kit</i>
J.K	7	🗸 🦫	Leave plenty of time to get to school: punctuality is important.
No.	8	\checkmark	If your child is finding their school work too hard speak to their teacher.
No.	9		Talk to your child about what they did in school today.
N.	10	\checkmark	If you or your child are worried or unhappy about something, contact the school.
