ATTENDANCE UPDATES

LEAVE OF ABSENCE

We have noticed an increasing number of families requesting a Leave of Absence from school. Requests for leave will not be granted for holidays, or if a pupil's authorised absence record is already above 10% for any reason. We have to report any Leave of Absence to the Local Authority, who issue fines to all relatives that live in the child's home.

Any request should be submitted as soon as it is anticipated and, where possible, at least 2 weeks before the absence, and in accordance with any leave of absence request form, accessible via the school office. The school may require evidence to support any request for leave of absence.
